# **In Memoriam**

Prominent Alpha-1 researcher **Maurizio Luisetti, MD**, of Pavia, Italy, passed away last October 20, 2014. He was a pioneer in Alpha-1 research and was considered the "father" of the Italian Alpha-1 patient and research community. The 5th Alpha-1 Congress' location was chosen because of Maurizio, and he was scheduled to be the Alpha-1 Research Conference's Chairman this year.

Maurizio Luisetti was medical director at the Clinic of Respiratory Diseases, IRCCS Policlinico San Matteo for 20 years, and head of the clinic's Laboratory of Biochemistry and Genetics for nearly 30 years in Pavia, where he coordinated an Alpha-1 research registry, testing program and research network. He was an adjunct professor at the University of Pavia's School of Respiratory Diseases.



Fellow researcher Francesco Bonella, MD, said, "Besides his outstanding competence and high international profile, Maurizio was a person with extraordinary humanity and commitment towards his patients and coworkers. He also believed that progress in research depends on cooperation and networking. "He will be sadly missed," said Bonella, "We have to continue our work with passion and determination in his memory. Thank you, Maurizio, for all you have done and all you gave us in these years."
